



3-Iron (Bin-jip) (NR) Limited Release - A homeless young man (Lee Seung-yun), who enters people's houses while they're away connects with a former model in an unhappy marriage. (1 hr. 35 min.)

The Amityville Horror (R) Wide Release - Supposedly based on a true story, this remake follows a young couple (Ryan Reynolds, Melissa George) and their children as they move into a house that was once the site of a horrific series of murders. (1 hr. 40 min.)

Bad Education (NC-17) Limited Release - In 1980 Madrid, a young filmmaker named Enrique meets an aspiring actor and writer, Ignacio, and they become fast friends. (1 hr. 49 min.)

The Ballad of Jack and Rose (R) Limited Release - A terminally ill father (Daniel Day-Lewis) sees his relationship with his daughter (Camilla Belle) change when he invites his girlfriend (Catherine Keener) and her kids to live with them. (2 hrs. 0 min.)

Beauty Shop (PG-13) Wide Release - Gina Norris (Queen Latifah) is a hairstylist who quits her job at an upscale salon to open her own shop, along with her particular sense of style. (1 hr. 45 min.)

Because of Winn-Dixie (PG) Wide Release - A 10-year-old girl moves to a small Florida town with her preacher father (Jeff Daniels), where she befriends a stray dog whom she names Winn-Dixie. (1 hr. 46 min.)

Be Cool (PG-13) Wide Release - John Travolta reprises his role as Chili Palmer in this sequel to 'Get Shorty.' (1 hr. 54 min.)

Being Julia (R) Limited Release - In 1930s London, actress Julia Lambert (Annette Bening), who rules the theater scene, falls for a young American named Tom. After she realizes that he's just using her to advance his romantic interests in up-and-coming starlet Avice Crichton, Julia plots her revenge. (1 hr. 45 min.)

The Best of Youth (R) Limited Release - Spanning four decades of Italian history, from the 1960s to the present day, this epic follows Nicola as he travels the world before settling down to a career in psychiatry. (6 hrs. 6 min.)

Boogeyman (PG-13) Wide Release - A young man (Barry Watson) can't get over horrific experiences he remembers from his childhood, so he returns to the house he grew up in to face his fears and discover if the boogeyman is real or imagined. (1 hr. 26 min.)

Brothers (R) Limited Release - Michael (Ulrik Thomsen) returns from a disastrous military mission - during which he was held prisoner in Afghanistan and presumed dead - only to discover that his wife (Connie Nielsen) may have started a relationship with his brother (Lie Kaas). (1 hr. 30 min.)

Bride & Prejudice (PG-13) Limited Release - Taking place in modern India, London, and the United States, this retelling of Jane Austen's classic story follows Lalita Bakshi (Aishwarya Rai) and her attempts to marry for love despite the plans of her mother. (2 hrs. 0 min.)

Constantine (R) Wide Release - A troubled man (Keanu Reeves) with the unique ability to see angels and demons as they walk the Earth teams up with a police detective (Rachel Weisz) to solve the mysterious death of her twin sister. (2 hr. 01 min.)

Crash (R) Wide Release - This ensemble drama tracks the intersecting lives of a group of Los Angelenos and features a cast that includes Sandra Bullock, Don Cheadle, Matt Dillon, and Brendan Fraser. Paul Haggis (who wrote Million Dollar Baby) makes his directorial debut. (1 hr. 40 min.)

Cursed (PG-13) Wide Release - After a car accident, Christina Ricci and Jesse Eisenberg play estranged siblings who survive a werewolf attack and are bound together by their curse. (1 hr. 36 min.)

Dear Frankie (PG-13) Limited Release - Lizzie (Emily Mortimer) is a single mom who long ago told her 9-year-old son that his father was away at sea on the HMS Accra (dad isn't on the ship, of course). (1 hr. 42 min.)

Death of a Dynasty (R) Limited Release - A young journalist, David Katz (Ebon Moss-Bachrach), who writes for a hip-hop magazine called 'Mic Check' gets too close to a hip-hop mogul (Capone) in a satirical look behind-the-scenes of Damon Dash's Roc-a-fella Records. (1 hr. 33 min.)
